#### Pick-up / Drop-off and Parking

We've been trialling a new pick-up, and drop-off zone during the first few weeks of this term. For the most part, it is working well, and we're seeing more of you making use of this zone - thank you! By moving the pick-up / drop-off zone, we could also free up at least 8 angled parking spaces. We're now talking to contractors about making these changes more permanent.

#### How you can help us

- Please don't park in the pick-up / drop-off zone and leave your car.
- When driving out of the zone, please use the cul de sac area to turn around. Making a u-turn in front of the school is dangerous, particularly during drop-off and pick-up times.
- All children should be accompanied by an adult when crossing the road.
- Please don't park on the yellow perforated lines on the Chapel side of the road.

Please remember to continue to check daily and treat these little nasties. Information about what to look for and how to treat them is available from the school office.



#### Student B.Y.O.D.



#### Uniform/Dress Code

Students enrolled at Waipa Christian School are required to wear the official school uniform. The uniform establishes a school identity and sense of belonging, and supports the school's efforts to create a sense of pride in personal appearance and in the school's image. The uniform also makes it easier for parents to decide what their child will wear to school each day, and eliminates peer pressure to dress in expensive "label" clothing.

The uniform is available from the office. Price lists are available at the front desk.

The school occasionally has used uniform items. Parents can indicate whether they would like these items, if available.

#### Guidelines

- Students must wear the correct school uniform at all times during the school day as well as on school trips when required.
- Parents/caregivers are responsible for labelling all uniform items. The school takes no responsibility for lost property.
- Hats must be worn in terms 1 and 4 whenever students go outside.
- The uniform must be clean, tidy, and in good repair.
- The only jewellery permitted are watches and simple ear studs (girls only).
- Hair must be clean and tidy. Colour enhancements can only be the same as the student's natural hair colour.
- Shaven patterns or Mohawks/rat-tails are not permitted.
- Any undergarments should not be seen (e.g. singlet, t-shirt, boxer shorts).
- Stick-on tattoos or drawings on the skin are not permitted.

#### Breaches of the dress code

- If a student is not wearing a school uniform item, they must have a note written by their parent/caregiver explaining why. Non-regulation items are only allowed to be worn for one day, when accompanied by a parent/caregiver note.
- Parents who do not comply with the school's uniform policy receive a standardised school note from the teacher first, followed by a personalised letter from the principal. Should the parents not meet the principal's request, they will be asked to attend a meeting with the board chair or principal and be reminded that they signed the enrolment agreement, which requires them to abide by school policies.



#### What is the Orton-Gillingham (O-G) Approach?

The Orton-Gillingham Approach is a direct, explicit, multisensory, structured, sequential, diagnostic, and prescriptive way to teach literacy when reading, writing,

and spelling does not come easily to individuals, such as those with dyslexia.

It is most properly understood and practiced as an approach, not a method, program, or system. In the hands of a well-trained and experienced instructor, it is a powerful tool of exceptional breadth, depth, and flexibility.

#### What is O-G Math?

The overriding principle of OG Math is "imagination, not rote memorisation" which supports greater conceptual and visual understanding of mathematics.

#### Why use O-G Math?


O-G Math is a multisensory mathematics approach that:

- 1. Encourages students to consciously "think" through processes which might be automatic for many.
- 2. Allows the student to experience touching, moving and building math concepts with concrete materials while seeing, explaining and hearing how math problems can be solved.
- 3. Teaches patterns of thought, i.e. the process needed to perform math functions and problem solving correctly, not just memorizing facts.
- 4. Develops in a structural and sequential way in order to fill any gaps in the child's knowledge of math functions, vocabulary and problem solving. Eventually, students develop adequate math skills to become independent learners.
- 5. Is a success-oriented program in which the students work at levels appropriate to their abilities.
