As we come to the end of the term we reflect on all the wonderful learning experiences that have taken place this term. Our main Inquiry for this term has been Science Investigations, where students have followed six scientific steps of a science inquiry. We intend on sharing these at the end of term assembly, where you will get to ask students questions and comment on their display presentation. The smaller unit taught this term was where students created a pepeha (a way of introducing themselves in Maori). This was an opportunity to practice oral language skills and to consider who and what is important to them.

In other curriculum areas we have focused on number and capacity in Maths and Explanation writing in Literacy. There have been many swimming opportunities this term, including water safety skills and a display of swimming skills. Other outdoor activities have included Bike Safety and a netball coaching session.

In these school holidays I am travelling to Canada to participate in a leadership opportunity for Principals from New Zealand and from other countries. I am attending this conference with many other Principals from New Zealand and as well as attending educational workshops, listening to international speakers, I have the opportunity to visit elementary schools in Calgary. I am attending this with around 50 other Principals from New Zealand and will return part way through week 1 of term 2. The end of term assembly will go ahead as usual on the last day of school (Fri 12th April) at 11am.

I wish to advise that Jemma Gloag has temporarily stepped down from the Presiding Member role on the board and that Karl French has taken up that position. We look forward to hearing from people that may have some interest in joining the board, as fresh ideas are always welcomed. 
Whanau groups
