


<p>Last week Ahuriri were learning about education in Finland, after Mrs Holden's trip to Finland in the school holidays. They were interested to see where Finland was located in Northern Europe and the travel path to get there. Ahuriri students learnt about a typical school day in Finland, discovered that Finnish people really enjoy taking a sauna and to learn that Finland is recognised as a happy and safe place in the world.</p> <p>The year 1-2 group then made a poster to share the facts they learnt about Finland. The year 3-4 group identified a country of interest to them (generally with some family connection) and researched facts, flags, maps and figures in a poster form also.</p> <p>They look amazing and are currently displayed in the Ahuriri classroom. Our older junior students are very good researchers and love to locate information.</p>

It's been a busy and exciting start to Term 4.

Students have been exploring our Solar System in Science, beginning with Mercury and Venus. To help understand Mercury's cratered surface, they carried out a fun hands-on experiment using flour as the mantle and cocoa powder as the crust, dropping different-sized rocks to see how craters form and how the layers react.

Our student inquiry projects are also in full swing for the final term, with a fantastic variety of ideas taking shape. We have young scientists mixing and experimenting (a big thank-you to the Hales family for donating some great little science boxes!), three different languages being explored, chisels and drills being used to make a homemade golf club, dough and dye turning into colourful sculptures, Christmas planning already underway, and many more creative projects on the go.

It's shaping up to be a wonderful final term of learning, making, and discovery!
