Kia ora e te whānau ō Henderson North School

We would like to extend our heartfelt thanks to our school community for your continued support. Your encouragement and understanding mean so much to the teachers and staff who work tirelessly for the wellbeing, learning, and future of your children.

At our school, striking is always considered a last resort. Our teachers and staff are deeply committed to their students, and stepping away from the classroom is never a decision taken lightly. However, in order to be heard and to advocate for fair pay and better working conditions, we join with thousands of essential public service workers across the country who are taking action.

Tomorrow, workers from a wide range of vital public services—including teachers, principals, doctors, nurses, allied health professionals, home support workers, school support staff, policy and advisory workers, specialist staff, and Ministry of Education field staff—will take part in strike action. This will be one of the largest collective actions seen in decades, with events confirmed at more than 40 locations from Kaitaia to Invercargill. These actions come after repeated breakdowns in negotiations over collective agreements for each workforce. Today, firefighters are also striking for one hour as part of their efforts to secure fair conditions.

We know that strike action can cause disruption, and we appreciate your patience and understanding during this time. Our hope is that through these efforts, the voices of those who care for, teach, and support our communities every day will be heard, respected, and valued.

Thank you once again for standing with us, for recognising the hard work of our educators and staff, and for being part of a community that supports fairness and respect for all workers.

PARKING!!!


Please be aware when you are dropping your children off and collecting them - if you park illegally you WILL get a ticket!






