

Correct Flanshaw Uniform

Please make sure your child/children arrives at school dressed in the correct uniform.

We are seeing different bottoms, ie (skirts, trousers, track pants, leggings and shorts), worn by both girls and boys plus non-regulation jackets and jumpers (Flanshaw hats only).

Orders for other uniform items can be made anytime, the order is emailed to the company on a Monday morning before 9.30am and is delivered to us by Wednesday, unless out of stock with the suppliers.

As we do not have a shoe policy, we would prefer footwear to blend in with the uniform, black, navy or white trainers (a little bit of colour is ok), sandals with backs on and no jandals, or crocks for safety reasons.

Shoulder length hair, girls and boys, must be tied up or back, this is to avoid catching nits (head lice). If your child does have nits, we have free nit shampoo in the school office. Please just come and ask.
