

'He kai kei aku ringa' - 'Resilience, empowerment and hope'

This year, we are weaving the theme of 'Whanaungatanga and Whenua' through all our planning and teaching. Taking this theme at the most literal level, it is about the people in our school – the students, staff and whanau that are part of this place of learning.



Attendance – Maximising opportunities for success in learning:

Each day the roll is taken at school twice a day. If we have not heard from parents about why their children are away, our office team ring families to make sure students have not gone missing on the way to school. The Ministry of Education also track attendance data in schools because they are concerned about students who are not attending school regularly. When reading students' Term 4 Student Portfolios at the end of last year, I saw a strong link between attendance levels and student progress in learning. Where students had been away a lot, in many instances achievement levels were below expected levels. That was the pattern.

So, how have we started with attendance this year? On Day 1, 2024, we had 89% of our students attending school. This is the average rate of attendance over the first two weeks at school. This means that already, we have around 27 students who have had two or more days off school in the first two weeks. Some have been sick. But, some absentees have not been justified and are of concern. To progress in learning, students need to be at school every day. It is the 'whanau on this whenua' that will make this happen. It is parents, teachers and staff working together that will make this happen. Let's make it happen.

Peace Foundation Peer Mediation:

This week, students in the Senior School have begun training to be Peer Mediators. This involves student mediators learning how to help students, in the playground, resolve problems. There are four steps in the mediation process —

- 1. To listen to each student state what they think the problem is.
- 2. To clarify what they have heard to make sure it is correct.
- 3. To ask students to identify ways they could resolve the issue.
- 4. To support students to choose the strategy they want to try.

Our school sasa was created to reinforce the 'Cool Schools' four step process – and a clip of our students performing this can be found on the NZ Peace Foundation website. It is impressive, as are our students! Teaching strategies to resolve issues is part of building confident, empowered, resilient students, who know how to 'make a difference in the world'.


