

FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S LAPTOP

Thank you all for your ongoing support, as we all get back into school routines. Often at the end of the summer break, students are used to staying up later in the evenings, staying in bed longer in the mornings and getting to places when they get there. With school starting back, days are more intense, school timetables replace holiday routines, and more organization is needed. Certainly that is the case in our household.



Teachers and staff attended a professional development training day last Friday, focused on conflict resolution. Peer mediation is not new, but the challenge of introducing it school wide, into every classroom is. There are four key steps that we use to solve low-level conflict at school -

- a) To listen to each side and paraphrase what the issue seems to be with each person
- b) To summarize what the issue/s are and get agreement from both parties that this is the case
- c) To brainstorm possible solutions together
- d) For each person to agree on the best solution going forward

Research from the world-renowned 'Dunedin Study' tells us that self-regulation - that is, the ability to manage our behaviour - is the most critical indicator of success in life. To have a kete of skills to problem solve minor conflicts, is important to learn, to use and to add to. At Flanshaw, we are all working on it.

Next week, on Friday 14 February, we invite all our new students, staff, teachers and whanau to a Whole School Powhiri. This will take place at 10.00 am in the school hall. If you are able to attend, please go to the staffroom at 9.45 am. Our student leaders will be there to guide you through this formal welcome to our school.

Finally, we hope everyone has a great Waitangi Day. At Flanshaw Road School, our goal is to normalize the use of Te Reo and tikanga of Te Kawerau-ā-Maki. We also want to ensure our tamariki learn our local history, as it really happened, so as to better understand the significance of Ti Tiriti o Waitangi. Rangi hari Waitangi. Happy Waitangi Day
