

Welcome back to school. We hope you had some enjoyable family time during the

break and that the new term has started well for you and your whanau.

Welcome to all our new families. We look forward to getting to know you. Tomorrow, Friday 2nd May, we have our Term 2 Powhiri to welcome new students and whanau to our school.



On Monday, 88% of our ngā ākonga (students) attended school. Whereas on Tuesday and Wednesday we had an average of 92%. I hope that this term we can have at least 90% of our students at school every day. The Government has a goal of 80% of ngā ākonga, cross the country, attending school more than 90% of the time. Even though we had an average of 90% last term we had under 70% of ngā ākonga attending school more than 90% of the time. This means we have some ngā ākonga not attending school regularly.

It has been a joy to see the ngā ākonga engaged in their learning this week. I have had a couple of students share their learning with me. I am looking forward to more ngā ākonga sharing their learning with me this term.
