
This whakatauki acknowledges team effort, that one's success is due to the support and contribution of many. Just as it takes a village to raise a child, it takes community to enable an individual's success.



Mothers' Day - Lemonade Scones

4 cups (600g) Self raising flour


 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup (56g) white sugar

½ teaspoon salt

300ml cream (1 small bottle)

300ml lemonade

Method



Preheat oven to 220°C conventional. Cover an oven tray with a sheet of baking paper or spray well with non-stick baking spray.

Mix all ingredients in a bowl to form a smooth dough (the mixture will be quite

Tip out onto a floured bench and form into a 'round'. Carefully lift and place onto baking tray (a dough scraper helps) and cut into wedges. Leave with the sides touching - scones will pull apart after baking.

Alternatively, use a cookie cutter or knife to cut scones into rounds or squares. Bake for 15 - 20 minutes, until cooked through and pale golden. Cool on a wire rack, covered with a clean tea towel (this keeps the scones lovely and soft).

Cut in half and serve warm with butter, jam and whipped cream.
