### St Leo's Catholic School – 2025 School Board Elections

All state and state-integrated schools, including St Leo's Catholic School, are required to hold board elections every three years. The next round of elections will take place this year, in September 2025.

St Leo's is a vibrant Catholic primary school with a rich heritage, committed staff, and a supportive and faith-filled community. Serving on the St Leo's School Board is a special opportunity to act as kaitiaki (guardian) of our school and its mission, and to help shape the strategic direction and vision for our tamariki through good governance.

Our school board consists of four elected parent representatives, three Proprietors representatives, the Principal, and a staff representative elected by staff.

You don't need to be a parent or caregiver of a child at the school to stand for election. You just need a genuine interest in supporting St Leo's Catholic School, strong communication skills, and the ability to work well as part of a team.

Every board member brings their own unique strengths. You might have experience in education, finance, leadership, or community involvement. You may also bring valuable insight into the diverse communities that make up our school.

### Reuben O'Neill Bursary

The Reuben O'Neill Bursary has been established by the Catholic Diocese of Auckland to assist in making Catholic

education available to some families and their children who otherwise would be unable to receive a Catholic education. The Reuben O'Neill Bursary has been established to honour Reuben O'Neill, who was an exceptional volunteer and supporter of Catholic education throughout his lifetime. Reuben O'Neill (1932-2025) was a husband, parent and grandparent and was recognised by Pope John Paul II in 1989 receiving a papal knighthood for his services to the Catholic Church of New Zealand. Reuben was proud of his own Catholic education and worked faithfully to make Catholic education accessible to as many people as possible, through building the Common Fund Cooperative, developing new schools, and improving the standard of existing schools across the Diocese of Auckland.

Whānau/families can apply at primary or secondary levels. Eligibility criteria include a desire for Catholic education for their child, and financial benefit to their family. Students of any year level can apply for the scholarship.

In 2025 5 primary and 5 secondary bursaries were awarded and are for the duration of a student's time at primary or secondary school. In 2026 an additional 5 primary and 5 secondary bursaries will be offered. It may be a family whose child is already enrolled in a Catholic school, or someone you know who desires a Catholic education for their child but for whom the associated cost of Attendance Dues are a barrier.
