Nga mihi nui ki a koutou whānau, and a warm St Leo's blessing on you all

We've kicked off Term 3 with great enthusiasm and energy. The children are settled and we have welcomed international students to our lovely kura. This Sunday we celebrate the feast day of St Clare of Assisi. On Monday we will hold a liturgy in St Clare to celebrate this special patron Saint.

Saint Clare of Assisi (1194-1253) was an Italian nun and a close companion of Saint Francis of Assisi. She founded the Order of Poor Ladies, later known as the Poor Clares, which was a monastic order dedicated to a life of poverty, humility, and simplicity. Saint Clare is known for her deep spirituality and commitment to living out the Gospel, and she played a significant role in shaping the Franciscan movement. Her devotion and leadership inspired many, and she was canonised as a saint by Pope Alexander IV in 1255.



St. Clare was designated as the patron saint of television in 1958 by Pope Pius XII, because when St. Clare was very ill, she could not attend mass and was reportedly able to see and hear it on the wall in her room. She is also the patroness of eye disease, goldsmiths, and laundry. Clare is often pictured carrying a monstrance or pyx, to commemorate the time she warded off the soldiers at the gates of her convent with the Blessed Sacrament. St. Clare's feast day is celebrated on August 11.

Ambassador Visit

Last Tuesday, our school had the honour of hosting Olympic ambassador Richie Patterson, a gold medalist and Commonwealth Games medalist. He shared his inspiring journey, beginning from his primary school days, and emphasised key values such as respect, resilience, and excellence. The tamariki were captivated by his story and engaged with thoughtful questions.

Last week St Patricks students visited the Depot Artspace and had a look at the Matariki sculptures. They were excited to view two in particular because they were curated by Ngahiwi and Natanahira. They finished the session by making their own stars focusing on the Matariki star Waiti.
