

This year marks 175 years of Ngā Whaea Atawhai o Aotearoa, Sisters of Mercy in New Zealand. Our Mercy story is a truly special one. The first Sisters, led by Mother Cecilia Maher, journeyed all the way from Ireland to New Zealand, learning te reo Māori on their voyage. Their journey took more than a month, and many knew they would never return home again; in fact, they even held their funerals before they left Ireland.

We celebrate and give thanks for 175 years of Mercy involvement in education, health, social justice, environmental care, outreach, and hospice work across Aotearoa. St Leo's is proud to be a Mercy school, continuing the legacy of compassion, courage, and service that began all those years ago.

#### Māori Collaborative Achievement Hui

This week, Ruth and I had the privilege of attending the Māori Collaborative Achievement Hui in Kirikiriroa (Hamilton). It was an excellent opportunity to deepen our understanding of Māori leadership, art, and storytelling. We explored the significance of Ngā Pou Aarohirohi – The Glistening Poles, created by artist Brett Graham, which represent unity, kaitiakitanga (guardianship), and the connection between land, water, and people.

The hui highlighted the importance of kotahitanga (working together in good faith) and the transition of responsibility and leadership through generations. We also learned about the Tainui history, local whakataukī drawn from the environment, and the symbolic relationship between father and son in waka leadership. It was an inspiring experience that reinforced the value of partnership, care, and cultural understanding in our learning communities.

We also visited Mangatoatoa Pā. The journey continued with visits to significant historical and cultural sites, including Alexandra Redoubt in Pirongia and the profoundly moving sites of Rangiaowhia. It was a day of reflection, learning, and appreciation for the wisdom and resilience within Te Ao Māori.


