Principal's Comment Nga Korero o te Tumuaki



It has been really pleasing to note the settled start that our students have made to Term 4. This is observed in classes, as well as at break times and when walking around various parts of the grounds in a calm and respectful manner. Teacher and Support Staff strike action - Thursday 23 October

At the end of last term in a school newsletter, and more recently through Hero and Facebook, parents were notified about the proposed nationwide strike action for primary teachers and support staff union members on Thursday 23 October. Their union, NZEI Te Riu Roa, has today provided formal notice to confirm that strike action will occur. On this day, our school won't be able to open for instruction due to the significant number of staff involved in the strike, and will therefore be closed on Thursday 23 October. Children will need to remain at home on this day.

Attendance

Across last term we experienced significant levels of sickness, which in turn saw a dramatic decrease in our overall attendance levels from what we had in terms 1 and 2. I appreciate that there is a fine line between when a student is too unwell to attend school (e.g. vomiting, heavy cold, cough or other medical condition) and when they could possibly attend school (e.g. a slight sniffle, which can be monitored throughout the day). Students should be at school unless there is a genuine reason not to be. For example, they should be at school on their birthday (unless it falls on the weekend or during term break), or if a sibling is sick, but they are well enough to attend school. If a child has 75% attendance or less, they are missing out on at least a term of learning each year. This will inevitably lead to gaps in learning. If families are experiencing any barriers to attending school, and would like to discuss this in confidence, please see either your child's classroom teacher, or myself.

Dyslexia Awareness Day

This past Thursday was Dyslexia Awareness Day and many of our students helped to raise awareness of this by adding something blue to their uniform / hair. A growing number of students are being assessed with dyslexia and schools are becoming more aware of how these students can be best supported in class. If you are driving down East Street in the evening, you will notice that the clock tower has been lit up in blue in support of this day. One of our students, Toby Green, had the honour of flicking the blue switch yesterday afternoon and it was great to be part of this occasion - well done Toby!

A reminder that school is closed for Labour Day on Monday 27 October. I wish all Allenton families a safe and enjoyable long weekend next weekend.



Let your child's teacher know if you would like some help getting set up on Hero, or come and see us in the school office.



Saturday Morning - Softball/Machine Pitch

This will be for under 13s (13 and under for girls). Kids must be at least 9 years old.

Competition runs term 4 and term 1. starting 11th of October through to 12th of December 12th (term 1 dates to be confirmed). It will be played as a transitional league, from machine pitch to softball.

- · Making games more exciting, as the ball is in play more.
- Giving players time to learn the game.
- Teaching Juniors how to connect with the ball.
- Giving pitchers the time needed to learn how to pitch.

Other Key factors to help everyone learn is –

- After 6 runners get home, it is side away, so one team does not end up fielding all game.
- The Home plate is bigger for the under 13s. Making it easier on pitchers learning to pitch.

How a transitional league works

- Machine Pitch is played first 2 weeks.
- Week 3 and 4 Machine pitch 3 innings 1 innings is pitched
- Week 5 and 6 Machine pitch 2 innings. 2 innings are pitched.
- Week 7 Machine pitch 1 innings. 3 innings are pitched.
- Week 8 All innings pitched.

Note – no games are played Labour weekend or Canterbury Anniversary weekend.

Games are not played during school holidays.

Games are 1 hour long.
