Principal's Comment Nga Korero o te Tumuaki



Last Tuesday morning we held our annual cross country at Argyle Park. The weather was spot on for the event! We were so impressed by the efforts that our children put into their races, and we appreciated the significant support that parents and whānau provided as well. Many thanks to everyone involved and to our staff who organised the event and assisted on the day. Today we sent a contingent of 24 Year 5 and 6 runners to the County Cross Country and we look forward to hearing how they got on.







Later that day we welcomed over 30 new children and staff to our school at our termly mihi whakatau, along with their families. It was wonderful to formally welcome them to Allenton. Many of the new children were supported by older siblings, which was great to see. In my whaikorero (speech), I referred to our local pepeha, noting local landmarks:

Ko wai matou? (Who are we?) Ko Opuke (Mt Hutt) te mauka (mountain) Ko Hakatere (Ashburton) te awa (river) Ko Arowhenua te marae (marae)



Ko Allenton te kura (school) Ko Hakatere te whenua (land)





We have experienced a growing degree of staff sickness over the past week. When this occurs, we always attempt to get a reliever to cover the class and ensure as much continuity as possible if the sickness continues for more than a day. It can often be difficult to get a reliever, as they may be booked at another school, and our part time staff are likely to be working in the school already. I thank parents and whānau for their understanding in this matter.

All schools are required to have an audited Annual Report which includes financial accounts and details of student achievement from the previous year. Our 2024 Annual Report is currently being finalised by the school auditors and will soon be available for public viewing on our website. We will let you know when this is available.

Some unsafe behaviour on and around our road crossings has recently been brought to my attention and I had to respond to five such incidences within a 20-minute period yesterday morning. This included drivers stopping to drop off children on the yellow lines next to the pedestrian crossing, which restricts the view of the children on road patrol. Drivers were seen performing U-turns close to the crossing. I witnessed a near car-on-car accident yesterday when this occurred. Some children have also been supported by parents to not use the pedestrian crossing by walking their children across the road reasonably close to the crossing, presumably to save time.

All of the above relates to a small minority, but it does make for an unsafe environment on Allens Road and Harrison Street at key times of the day. Our road patrol monitors and parent volunteers do a great job at the start and end of the day, and we are grateful for what they do, but at times this crucial role is made more challenging than it needs to be. I therefore respectfully request that all parents support student safety by adhering to the road rules and being positive role models for our children.

As previously noted, school will be closed for instruction on Monday 2 June (King's Birthday), Tuesday 3 June (staff development) and Friday 20 June (Matariki).
