And for the first time ever, we had two roopu entered; our *Piringatahi* teina making their Putangitangi debut; while the *Tuinga Tahi* tuakana racked up their seventeenth year in the competition. After much delay and prevarication; it was great for the kids to finally get the chance to put all of their hard work and preparation to the test of competition.

Piringatahi got to be the very first team to take the stage this morning; and they made their tutors, whanau, and supporters proud. It was a well-rehearsed and well-executed performance - you simply couldn't have asked for more. A couple of hours later, *Tuinga Tahi* were the first up performance in their competition too. Again; a slick and polished presentation: we are very proud of both roopu.

None of this stuff happens by magic. Our school is lucky to have the quality of tutors that we do; the staff commitment that we have; and - just as importantly - the whanau support that we enjoy: we really do appreciate the sheer magnitude of the whanaukataka and manākitaka our community provides: your pride is tangible and thoroughly justifiable - thank you all.

Irrespective of the outcomes of today; the fact that Piringatahi is not only up and running alongside *Tuinga Tahi*; and has gone through the baptism of public performance: kapa haka is further strengthened as a part of our school's curriculum kaupapa.

Just as well; there are [some pretty serious changes being made to the legislation that will have major impacts on what schools - and individual teachers - can and can't do](#); can and can't teach; and the Minister of Education of the day will be calling most of the shots.


