Kia ora e te whānau

Learning in classrooms is in full swing! It's also been great to have Tim and Harold onsite delivering lots of valuable messages that link to our PEAK Goals.

We have recently received our confirmed 'School Evaluation Report' from the Education Review office.

This report includes some great findings about what is happening within our Kura and some next steps and elements we can also enhance. For the next few weeks we will include some snippets of this report in our newsletter—you are also welcome to read the full version online.

Learner Success and Wellbeing

Most learners make sustained progress and achieve well at the appropriate curriculum level in reading, writing and mathematics. Achievement information shows that most learners are meeting curriculum expectations in reading, writing and mathematics; Māori and Pacific learners achieve at similar levels to their peers.

At the end of 2024 our data shows:

- 90% of learners achieved at or above the expectation in Reading
- 83% of learners achieved at or above the expectation in Writing
- 81% of learners achieved at or above the expectation in Maths

This year we are working collaboratively with a group of other rural schools to enhance the way we teach maths. We are engaged in 'The Learner First' professional development programme which is focused around the design of maths tasks that enable and extend all learners to achieve at their highest potential. We are also reviewing the processes we use in the classroom to monitor learning progress. Our learners now also all have PR1ME maths workbooks that are provided by the Ministry of Education as part of a nationwide initiative. These workbooks are a great addition to our maths

programmes and give learners plenty of different opportunities to practice new concepts. Thank you for the effort that is going in at home learning basic facts and times tables too.

What is Makaton?

Makaton is a communication programme which uses speech, signs and/or symbols. It is designed to help children and adults with communication difficulties to develop more effective communication.

How does it work?

In New Zealand the signs used with Makaton are from New Zealand Sign Language (NZSL). Key words are signed in the same order as spoken language. This enables us to sign and speak at the same time.

Combining signs and/or symbols with speech has been shown to be very effective for many children and adults.

Who can use Makaton?

Makaton is used widely in New Zealand with a wide agerange from babies through to adults. It is used by parents and carers, teachers, speech-language therapists and many others.
