What Would Success Look Like? Success means maintaining or increasing our regular/good attendance by significantly reducing areas of unjustified absences.

Our current baseline shows 80% of our students have regular/good attendance. To ensure every child can strive to Reach their PEAK, we need to focus on reducing the remaining 20% of absences that are irregular or concerning.

The most common examples of unjustified absences include:

- Families taking holidays in term time.
- Not returning to school immediately after a justified appointment/activity.

We urge all whānau to use the upcoming term breaks and scheduled school holidays to plan family trips and non-urgent appointments. By doing so, you help us reduce unjustified absences and ensure your child achieves the required 90% attendance for consistent learning success in 2026.
