Positive announcements in New Zealand Education: Attendance & Achievement Its very easy to only focus on the negative but over the past 2 weeks we have as a nation had some extremely positive results Improved Attendance:

National school attendance has risen and is now back to pre-COVID levels. Nearly 60% of students are attending regularly (71% at Solway over the last 12 months), up from around 40% in 2022. This means 60% are missing less than 5 days a term. More students and parents now recognise the importance of being at school every day, which is a key factor in learning success.

Literacy & Numeracy Progress:

ERO's reports also highlight early signs of improvement in English and Maths. Almost all schools have adopted the refreshed curriculum, and most teachers have changed how they teach literacy and numeracy. Many are already seeing better student progress, especially in primary years.

While challenges remain, these national trends are positive and reflect growing efforts across schools to lift engagement, attendance, and achievement for all learners.

Basic Fact-athon Fundraiser: Our Solway Basic-fact-a-thon is not far away - funds are to be invested in keeping our **swimming pool** going.

Congratulations - Last night we had the first Board meeting for our newly elected Solway Board of Trustees. Thank you Katie Grant who will serve as our new board Chairperson and Shannon Bayliss who was elected Treasurer. Thank you also to Kelly Lissington who had been acting Chairperson and to fellow board members Jaco Le Roux and Sean Jarvis.
