#### **Teacher Practice**

# **The Duck Dash**



A duck race fundraiser is a charity event where the community donate \$2 per numbered rubber duck. The ducks are assigned by number to the donors.

These ducks are then released en masse into a body of water, and raced to the predetermined finish line. The first ducks to cross the finish line wins the prize of a Gelato Lab voucher.

There are 20 ducks in each race. There will be ten races in total. In each race you are allowed to sponsor a maximum of three ducks.

The money raised will go towards costs of flights and accommodation for our students representing New Zealand in the Tournament of Minds competition in Sydney.

If possible, can a family member accompany any child to the office to choose a duck/s and donate.
