A chance to "stop and think" about how we support young people.

Over-parenting, often stemming from a desire to protect and smooth the path for children, can inadvertently hinder their development of self-esteem and capability. While well-intentioned, constantly solving every problem for a child robs them of crucial opportunities to learn, adapt, and build resilience.

When parents consistently step in, children miss out on the valuable experience of navigating challenges, making mistakes, and discovering their own solutions. This can foster a sense of helplessness and dependence, leading to diminished self-confidence.

Children need opportunities to observe themselves achieving success. Let's let them do things on their own, make mistakes, fail and learn.

At school let's have students carry their own bag, put away their own gear, and remember their own sports gear on the right day. Do your older children have the opportunity to make their own school lunch? Just a thought...


