A Road Safety Story

In my ten years working at St Mark's as deputy principal and now as principal, an area of real worry for me has always been that slightly chaotic time every day from 2:50 - 3:10pm, as students and parents meet up and head home. Locarno Street has been my biggest worry.

Over the years I can count five different incidents where I have had to grab a student to stop them running into the path of oncoming cars. I don't know how many times other staff members have done the same. I think we can all agree that a serious road accident involving our children would be one of the worst things a school can experience. I ask multiple staff members to do extra duty out there every day as an added layer of safety for students.

Last year one of our concerned parents, Mr Adrian Easton, worked alongside the council to have a new safety plan implemented which included a bus park, yellow lines and a three minute pick up zone. These changes have vastly improved the situation at our unofficial crossing area, for which I am forever grateful.

The majority of parents are gracious and thoughtful. They follow the rules even if it means some inconvenience. Thank you! There are also some people who continue to ignore the rules, park illegally, block driveways and put others at risk.

I have reached out to Christchurch City Council for assistance in clarifying the parking rules so that everyone understands their responsibilities. The following page comes straight from the council.

The parking enforcement team have put St Mark's on their list of schools to visit in the coming weeks.

Nobody ever wants the hassle and expense of a parking fine. I'd like to pre warn everyone. If we all park legally, we will have no problems.

Park smarter around schools

Help us create a safer environment around your kura – for all ākonga (students), mātua (parents) and kaimahi (staff).

Common parking restrictions

Parking restrictions are in place to help keep everyone safe and reduce congestion.



This will be at the safest drop-off and pick-up place. You can stop here for three minutes only – enough time for children to say goodbye and leave the car.



This means parking is restricted to the number of minutes on the sign. P120 means you can only stop there for 120 minutes.



Broken yellow lines along the edge of the road mean you can't stop, pull over, or park there at any time.



You must leave a one metre gap between your car and any driveway.



You must not park your car on the footpath or in a way that blocks the footpath.



You must not stop or park within six metres of any crossing or intersection.

Breaking these rules can result in a fine.
