I know that a straight line is 180 degrees and a point is 360 degrees and we use a protractor to measure angles.


Stirling Leigh

Garden To Table







Pin Wheel Scones

- 2 cups plain flour
- 4 tspn baking powder
- 1 tspn salt
- 60gm butter cut in small pieces
- ¾-1 cup milk

Savoury fillings-choose from

- -cheese
- -herbs
- -salami
- -onion
- -greens
- -tomato paste

Turn oven on to 200 deg. & line a baking tray with baking paper.

Method

- Sift flour & baking powder into a large bowl
- Add the butter
- Add the milk
- Stir quickly and don't overstir
- Tip dough onto floured board, knead & fold several times & sprinkle with flour if needed
- Roll out into square 30x30cm
- Spread with chosen fillings
- Roll up, cut log in 2cm slices
- Place on baking tray and bake for 10-15 minutes


