Level 1: 71% Level 2: 77% Level 3: 82%

Thank you all for committing to the learning journey at Northland College. We have exceeded our expectations in terms of the targets set in our annual plan and I look forward to seeing continued improvement in 2026.

Mathematics Faculty

Level 3 Mathematics & Statistics:

There were 13 tauira enrolled in this course at the start of the year—3 Year 12 and 10 Year 13 students. One student completed two Achievement Standards in 2024 and a further two this year. Two students left kura after Term 2.

We are proud to acknowledge that all remaining tauira—the 8 Year 13 students and 2 Year 12 students—have successfully achieved University Entrance in Mathematics, earning the required 14 internal credits. Ka mau te wehi!

Level 2 Mathematics & Statistics:

At the start of the year, 19 tauira were enrolled in this course. Over the year, four tauira withdrew from the college, and a further three adjusted their subject choices. In Term 3, algebra and calculus were introduced to support and enhance our tauira's overall program of learning. The most dedicated tauira achieved worthwhile gains in their credit acquisition.

Level 1 Mathematics & Statistics:

This year, our tauira have made impressive gains in subject knowledge, work habits, discipline, and credit acquisition. They demonstrated a genuine commitment to our wānanga sessions in Term 4, engaging in targeted catch-ups across a range of subjects. Each whānau group and class brought its own unique energy and character to the learning environment, enriching the overall learning experience.

Year 9 and Year 10 Mathematics & Statistics:

Throughout the year, our junior school cohort has engaged in a broad range of topics across the Algebra and Number, Measurement and Geometry, and Statistics and Probability strands. A select group of students also had the opportunity to sit the CAA—Common Assessment Activity (online/web-based), worth 10 credits. With regular attendance, sustained effort, application, and commitment, our students are well-positioned to make strong progress as they continue their learning journey.

Measles immunisation – key information

- Measles is currently spreading in Aotearoa New Zealand. This is a serious illness that spreads easily and can affect both children and adults.
- Two doses of the MMR vaccine after 12 months of age protects 99% of people from measles.
- The MMR vaccine is free for anyone under 18, and for adults 18+ eligible for free healthcare in New Zealand.
- If you or your child haven't had two measles immunisations, or are unsure, it's
 recommended you get immunised. It is safe for most people to receive another
 dose.
- Children with two recorded doses after 12 months of age will not need to stay home if exposed to a measles case.
