A source of tension between students can, at times, be harihari korero - idle gossip and spreading rumours. The key message shared was to ask three key questions before sharing any such korero: is it true? Is it necessary? Is it kind? If the answer to any or all of these questions is 'no' then the korero should stop there. Our taitamariki live in a 24/7, connected world where social media can amplify issues around gossip. Whānau can support us and their tamariki by having these discussions at home to support what is shared at kura.

Māori Touch Tamariki Tournament



Level 3 Mathematics

Students are completing coursework requirements for their first assessment. AS91587- Apply systems of simultaneous equations in solving problems 3.15 [3 credits].

Level 2 Mathematics

Students are completing coursework requirements for their first assessment as well. **AS91256 - Apply coordinate geometry methods in solving problems [2 credits]** All students will complete 1.3.& 1.4 achievement standards [Level 1] as well throughout the year

Level 1 Mathematics

This term, students will cover topics from 1.2 AS 91945 Explore mathematical problems related to life in Aotearoa New Zealand or the Pacific [5 credits - Internal] and 1.4 AS 91947 Demonstrate mathematical reasoning [5 credits External]. Both topics will complement their coursework requirements for US 32406, the CAA - Common Assessment activity - Online/web-based [10 credits], which will be held in Term 2 Week 6 [a further test will be conducted in Term 3]

Note: All students will be eligible to sit this Common Assessment activity.

Year 9 & Year 10 Mathematics

All classes will cover topics from the 5 strands - Number, Algebra, Measurement, Geometry, and Statistics in preparation for **US 32406 the CAA - Common Assessment activity - Online/web-based [10 credits],** and the normal testing regime of our Kura.
