- Through individual conversations when necessary.



Stepped Attendance Response (STAR)

STEP 1: Good Attendance (≤ 5 days absent/term)

- . Monitor attendance regularly.
- Celebrate good attendance (certificates, rewards).
- Communicate with whanau about the importance of attendance.





- . Support students to catch up.
- Offer in-school help (e.g., counselling, food).
- · Send formal notice if patterns emerge.
- · Track interventions closely.



STEP 3: Concerning Attendance (≤ 15 days absent/term)

- · Escalate communication with parents.
- · Hold face-to-face meetings to understand issues.
- · Create a tailored support plan.
- · Involve external agencies if needed.
- · Monitor progress with regular check-ins.



STEP 4: Serious Concern (> 15 days absent/term)

- · Send formal warning and meet urgently.
- · Launch multi-agency response.
- Implement Intensive Attendance Plan.
- · Consider Ministry/legal action if unresolved.
- · Unenrol only as a last resort under

STEP 5: Daily Operations

- · Review attendance weekly in leadership
- · Share trends with staff each term.
- · Survey students and whanau yearly to identify

STEP 6: Community Collaboration

- · Work with agencies (e.g., Attendance Services, Oranga Tamariki).
- · Join local attendance hui.
- Share strategies with whānau and community

Step 7: Communication & Reporting

- · Report attendance to the Board each term.
- · Provide updates via newsletters and website.
- · Share student attendance reports with parents at least twice a year.

STEP 8: Review & Improvement

- · Review attendance plan and data annually.
- · Collect feedback from staff, whanau, and
