Stepped Attendance Response (STAR)

STEP 1: Good Attendance (≤ 5 days absent/term)

- · Monitor attendance regularly.
- Celebrate good attendance (certificates, rewards).
- . Communicate with whanau about the importance
- of attendance.



- · Contact parents to discuss absences.
- . Support students to catch up.
- Offer in-school help (e.g., counselling, food).
- · Send formal notice if patterns emerge.
- · Track interventions closely.



STEP 3: Concerning Attendance (≤ 15 days absent/term)

- · Escalate communication with parents.
- Hold face-to-face meetings to understand issues.
- · Create a tailored support plan.
- · Involve external agencies if needed.
- · Monitor progress with regular check-ins.

STEP 4: Serious Concern (> 15 days absent/term)

- Send formal warning and meet urgently.
- · Launch multi-agency response.
- Implement Intensive Attendance Plan.
- Consider Ministry/legal action if unresolved.
- · Unenrol only as a last resort under guidelines.


