- If there is a change to the usual way your child goes home in the afternoon, please contact the school office before 2pm, so this can be actioned. If the school is not informed, the student will be sent home as per usual.

Remember to collect the "YUMMY" stickers and tokens that are on apples and send them into school please. The more we have, the more money we get to purchase PE sports gear for our students.

PTA Update

Last year the PTA was disbanded as a formal entity as there were not enough volunteers to commit to continuing it. All the appropriate procedures have been followed and are now complete. This means that the existing PTA funds have been transferred and held by the school. These funds are in a *separate account and the school and school board do not have control* over how the money will be allocated to projects.

There will be an "Awhitu Supporters" group (sub-committee of the school) which anyone can be part of. This group can meet to discuss how the money can be allocated to the school and to the students as needed. Just the same as what happened before.

Traditionally, the PTA have provided funds to support the cost of buses to the School Cross Country and a Beach Buddy trip. They have made a contribution to the senior camp and junior trips, and pledged money for art, PE and extra curriculum resources. The PTA have also put an amount aside each year to be used for a future "PTA Special Project". Some funds are always set aside to run the Easter Auction and Calf Club events.
