This week we have had an extra focus on te reo Māori, as we celebrated the 50th anniversary of Te Wiki o te reo Māori. Our week-long focus culminated in a series of activities in the middle block on Friday, working in Ngā Manu groups: A song about the whetu waka from Hawaiki, bingo with te reo Māori numbers up to rua tekau (20), a traditional action game, and step-by-step drawing of a taniwha.

The day was wrapped up with a whole school sharing time in the hall and lowering of the New Zealand flag. What a great day it was!



The Office Has Moved:



Over the holidays, Stage 3 of the asbestos removal will begin in the middle of the school – the admin area, the ESOL room, the mobility toilet and the classrooms that have been occupied by the three Kimi Ora classes.

It is going to be a long process, which means that the office had to be moved. So, for the bulk of term 4, you will find Cherie and me in our temporary office in the 'Resource Room', just around the corner from Room 7. The door that leads from the classes out to the hall will be our temporary main entrance.

From Tuesday afternoon (23/9) the gates into the school will be locked, while the asbestos is removed over the holidays. Once school starts, removal will only be happening at night, and there will be walls separating the usable parts of the school from the construction site, to ensure everyone is kept safe.



By week 2 of the term, all the asbestos should be gone and the rebuild will begin. It will be 'messy' and inconvenient for a good part of the term, but the outcome will be worth it.

Enjoy this next two weeks with your kids and we will see everyone back, safe and sound on Monday 6 October.
