
My name is Chevy, and I am the Social Worker in Schools (SWiS) at Rongomai School. In this role, I work in partnership with tamariki and their whānau to provide social support, including advocacy, referrals for food parcels, and assistance with other needs as they arise.

I am based at Rongomai School every Monday and Friday from 8:30 am – 4:00 pm in the Student Support building. I am also available throughout the week during business hours and can be contacted via phone (027 518 8622) or email (chevy@taiawa.org.nz).

Beginning next term, I will also be offering dedicated support sessions for parents and whānau who wish to create or update their CVs and/or cover letters. These sessions will run every week (Monday and Friday) between 9:00 am – 11:00 am. Bookings are not required—you are welcome to visit my office during these times.


