I am so proud of the resilience our students are showing around camp. Each time I pop out, there are lots of smiling faces and adventure stories to be told. For some students, camp is a big challenge being away from home and with their peers, so seeing and hearing how well they are doing, is a credit to the students, teachers and parents.

What was identified was that the language (words) some of our students are using, is not school appropriate. Swearing is not ok at school and this will be a deliberate focus and work on over the next few weeks.
