During these first two weeks we have had a number of opportunities to practice what our 3 C's look like in practice, with our students being reminded they have a responsibility to make a positive difference in other peoples lives and also in their own. The majority have shown Common Sense and Consideration with the increased number of builders, road workers and visitors we currently have both at school and on our surrounding roads.

Over the break, I had the chance to collate and identify key themes in our community, student and staff feedback in relation to our schools strategic goals and direction for the next 3 years. There are strong themes that were similar through out each group and which will be helpful as we set the direction for our school as we strive to be the best we can be for our students and community. The main themes are recorded in the order of % each idea was identified. This does not mean one theme is more important that another, rather they fit together to create an environment where we have Empowered learners Inspired to Achieve:

- 1) Opportunities this included comments around sports, music, clubs and art. A number of people mentioned the importance of both the formal and informal opportunities
- 2) 3Cs/School Values a number of people, including whaanau, students and staff, indicated that being kind, respectful and using the 3Cs was key to MIS being a place they felt they could succeed and be safe.
- Learning targeted to meet the needs of each student school is for learning and I was pleased to see all groups surveyed, placed this as a priority.
- 4) Connections and friendships a number of whaanua spoke about the importance of their child feeling happy and enjoying school and students themselves, talked about friendships. There are strong links between this theme and the first 3, as if we get the opportunities, values and learning correct, then connections and sense of belonging create the foundation to our students' thriving.


