Matariki, a significant Māori cultural event marking the beginning of the Māori New Year, has been a focal point of learning this term alongside our school inquiry Tūrangawaewae. Our students have been exploring the traditions, stories, and symbolism associated with Matariki, and they will have displays ready to share. It's a chance to celebrate their achievements and learn more about this meaningful time. The event will start at 3.00pm and go till 6.00pm. We encourage you to join us, even if it's only for a short time, and we will have soup available at no cost.

As part of our Porirua East Kahui Ako (cluster of schools) - we have been learning the Matariki actions for Ngā marama o te tau Māori by Dr Rangi Mātāmua on www.livingbythestars.co.nz. As a school, we will record it, and send it away to be compiled with the rest of the schools recordings and then shared across all participating schools.
