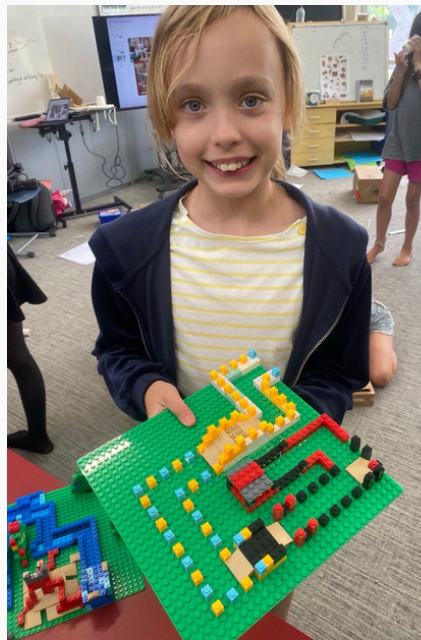
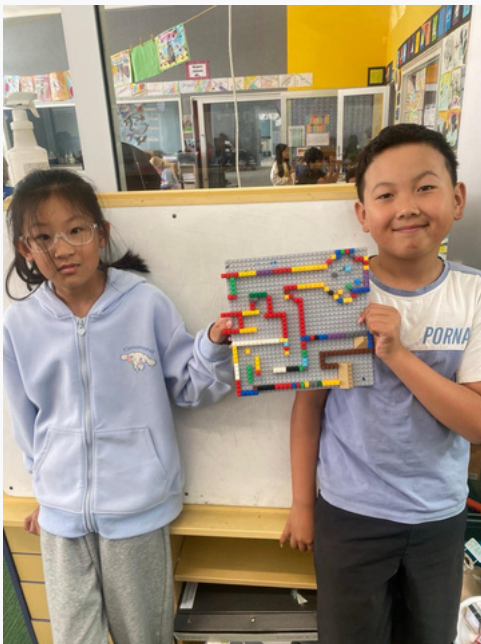
Classes with Jo Rea, our STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) specialist, have been focusing on technology this term.

Room 9 have been working on a range of activities that involve looking at forces, momentum, tilt, pushing and pulling.

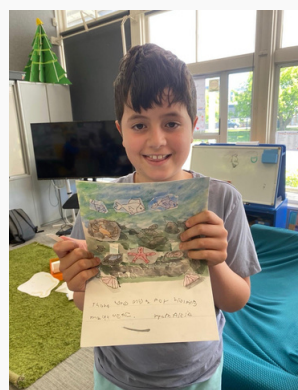
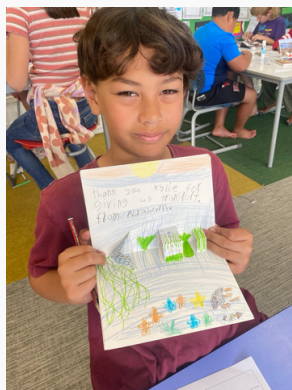
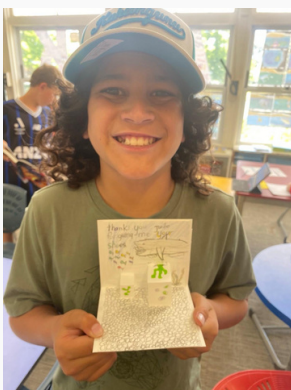




Room 6 made marble runs.

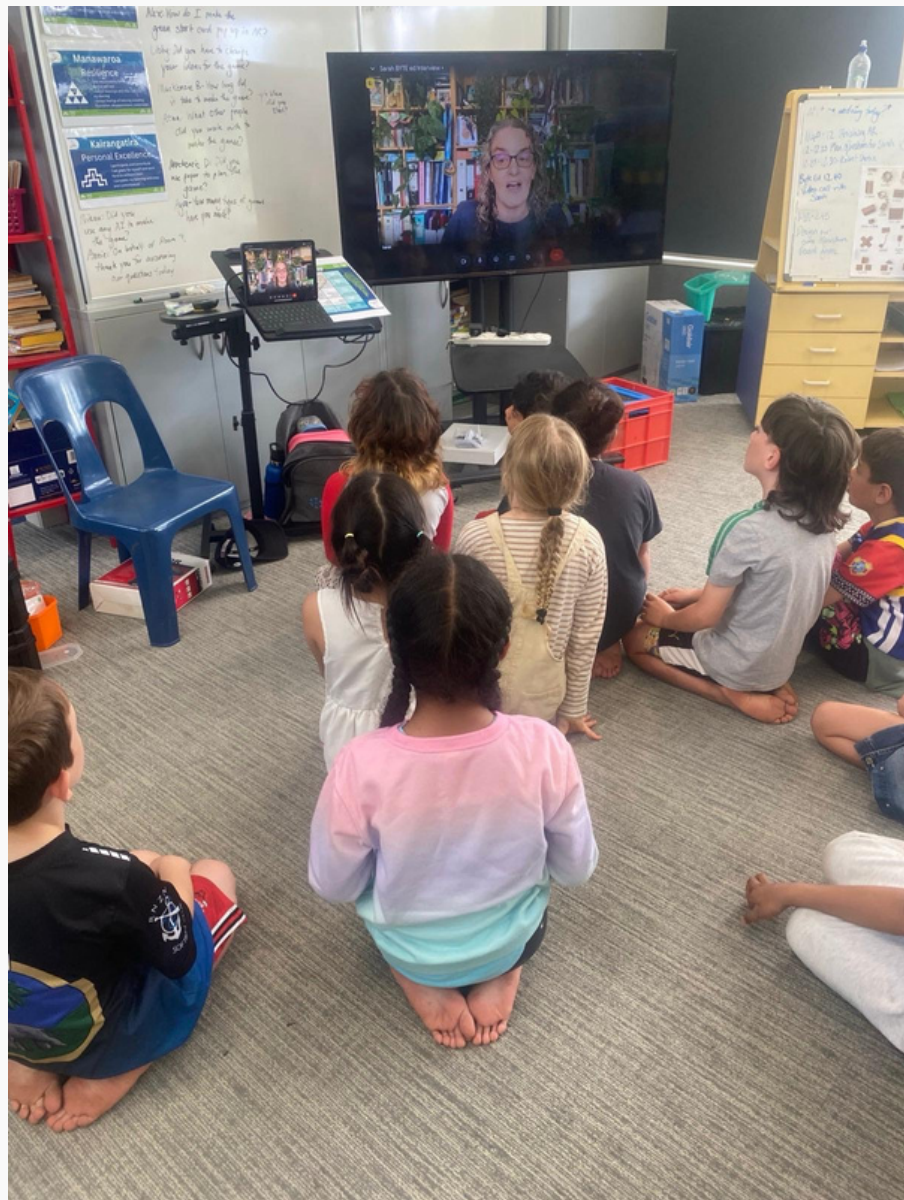


Room 4 made pop-up cards to thank the caregivers who helped on their MERC trip.
