Last Friday Room Two attended the Rūnā programme at the Wakatere Boating Club.

Rūnā is an exciting new schools' sailing programme that integrates ocean adventure with science and sustainability in the classroom.

Developed by Yachting NZ, RŪNĀ connects schools with their local yacht clubs and equips Kiwi kids with **essential water skills for life**. It is the perfect intro to sailing for students ahead of their Waterwise program in year 6.

The programme offers three inspiring modules which include in-classroom learning experiences delivered by teachers, supported by an action packed sailing experience at the local yacht club, and culminates with a call for learners to take action.

- **Kōkōkaha – Powered by Wind:** Design wind-powered technologies to address climate change.
- **Kōrinorino – Our Ancestors' Wake:** Explore Aotearoa's histories and local settlement stories.
- **Moanamana – New Zealand's Blue Belt:** Restore marine ecosystems and learn about sustainable waterways.
