Thank you to all our whānau who joined us, without your help such trips could not happen. It was great to see everyone getting involved - it certainly seemed we are never too old to play!





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

Come and join us for a morning of tidying, weeding and gardening. Focus areas:


Senior School and Bayswater Ave boundaries
