Structured Literacy

Bayswater School began its Structured Literacy journey a few years ago recognising the strength of the pedagogical approach and ably led by Claire (DP). Last week we began formal Professional Learning Development (PLD) on the approach, funded by the Ministry of Education. This included everyone being introduced to a new formative assessment tool called Dibels. This will replace traditional phonics assessments we have used previously.

Like all good assessment tools the purpose is to show what a child can do and what each child's next steps will be - more on this in 2025. A large group of the staff will have further PLD days starting this Thursday. We are lucky to have some experienced and regular relievers at school who will ably teach the classes while teachers are out over the next term.
