On the last Friday of the holidays, all the teachers in the Rangitikei got together for a Kāhui Ako afternoon, along with Ngā Wairiki Ngāti Apa and the Healthy Active Learning team from Sport Whanganui at the Rūnanga on Hendersons Line.

The focus of the day was learning the pūrākau (story) of Haunui-a-Nanaia, who travelled down the coast from South Taranaki to Pukerua Bay, just past Paraparaumu, and named the awa along the way. How the Whanganui, Whangaehu, Turakina, Rangitikei and Manawatū rivers, and ones further south, got their names was learnt.

Following this, the Healthy Active Learning team taught some kēmu (games) that could link to the pūrākau. The collaboration between schools, iwi and Sport Whanganui made for a fun afternoon with lots of rich learning, which your students should be able to tell you about soon!
