speaker, delivered a powerful message rooted in mātauranga Māori, encouraging our rangatahi to breathe, reflect, and lead with heart. Students also enjoyed an energetic session from Jari of Dance Curriculum, which got everyone moving and reinforced the power of creativity and expression. 

EKETĀHUNA SCHOOL CROSS COUNTRY



INTRODUCING OUR BOARD MEMBER - Ngaio Hanson

Can you tell us a little bit about yourself (e.g. your job, family, hobbies)?

I have three children who have all attended Eketahuna School, two are currently still attending here. I grew up on a farm in Nireaha and I am now a Shearing Contractor.

What were you like at school? Was learning easy or hard for you?

When I was at school, I enjoyed learning, but some things were a little tricky. I worked hard to understand new things, and I always tried my best. It wasn't always easy, but I learned that with patience and effort, I could always achieve what I set out to.

What is your role on the Board of Trustees, and what does it involve?
