Our Eketāhuna School House Team Leaders have been busy this year taking part in the Pūkaha Mt Bruce Conservation Leadership Programme. As part of this learning, they have been working alongside Mr Pallister to plan and launch their very own project here at school. Their vision is to develop a bush trail with interactive activity stations in our school's native bush area — a space where students can explore, play, and connect with nature. Inspired by the beauty of our local environment, and research into other schools, the team is excited to create features such as a music station made from recycled items, weta bug & hotels, rustic seating spaces, rope swings and climbing challenges and a native bird feeding station.



# Dear Eketāhuna communuty

Kia ora, Eketāhuna Leaders in Conservation here.

We are very excited with our idea for a trail with activity stations in our bush area at school. We've had a good look through the area we would like to develop today and are really excited about the possibilities. We are asking for donations of the following items to help us start creating this space.

- Old pots and pans and any other objects to create a music station.
- Wood pellets in good condition.
- Strong long rope for rope swing(s)
- Wood for building raised activity stations. These would be concreted into the ground so would need to be something like a 1.8 metre fence post or 100 x10 post. Used ones in good condition would be great.
- Logs that can be cut up for rustic seating.
- Pinecones to create a native bird station – bird feeders.

Any contributions would be most welcome.
