HEALTH UPDATE - MEASLES INFORMATION

You may have seen the information sent home on Monday regarding the increased risk of measles across New Zealand, with confirmed cases in the Wellington area. At this stage, there are no cases connected to Eketāhuna School, and we continue to follow advice from Health New Zealand and the Ministry of Education. We encourage all families to read the information shared earlier this week and to check their child's immunisation status. Measles is highly contagious, but vaccination provides strong protection. If your child becomes unwell with symptoms such as fever, cough, runny nose, sore eyes, or a rash, please keep them at home and phone your doctor or Healthline (0800 611 116) for advice. We'll continue to keep our community updated should any new information arise. Thank you for helping us keep our tamariki and wider community safe and well.

House Leaders Award!


Our House Team Leaders Award is a new student-led initiative recognising children who demonstrate our school values during break times. Each week, our student leaders will be on the lookout


LATE STUDENTS


HATS & SUNSCREEN


