NOTIFYING SCHOOL WHEN CHILDREN ARE ABSENT IS ESSENTIAL



Your child should go to school every day. But sometimes they might need to be away because they are too sick to attend, have an appointment or need to be at a tangi or funeral. If your child is going to be away from school you need to let us know as soon as possible. You will need to let us know that your child will be away, why and for how long.

Your child's safety and wellbeing is a priority for us. We monitor the daily attendance of students to:

- ensure their safety both in getting to school, & in accounting for them in an emergency
- identify students with achievement, engagement, or other issues
- meet our legal responsibilities.

The school expects parents and caregivers to:

- notify the school if their child is going to be absent by phone, text, or email by 9 am
- try to arrange appointments etc. outside school hours or in holidays

If your child doesn't turn up to school and we don't hear from you, we will get in touch with you to make sure your child/ren are safe. Thank you for your ongoing support with this.



PLEASE BRING YOUR OWN WATER BOTTLE DAILY

At school we have a filtered water bottle filler for students to access for fresh drinking water. Due to colds, bugs and germs we no longer have any shared drinking fountains operating so it is vital that all students come with their own water bottle. Please check that your child has their bottle, with their name on it, packed in their bag each day. Thank you for your support with this.
