

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE - IMPORTANT UPDATE FOR FAMILIES

Our goal is for every child to attend more than 90% of the time so they can make steady progress in their learning. This aligns with the Government's focus on lifting regular attendance. The Ministry of Education's Stepped Attendance Response (STAR) sets clear expectations for how schools and whānau work together to address absence and support students back to regular attendance. As part of the national approach, schools are expected to use STAR now, and government regulations will require every school board to have a published Attendance Management Plan in place from Term 1, 2026, with tiered responses at defined absence thresholds. We will continue aligning our practices to these requirements.

How this looks at our kura:

 We monitor attendance closely and will be in touch with some families where attendance has fallen below expected levels. STAR outlines a stepped response—from early reminders and offers of support through to formal notices if absences continue—so that no student is left to accumulate absences without action.



- You will receive communication for every absence; please always let us know the reason as soon as possible. This helps I
 us support your child and keep records accurate.
- Where attendance remains very low and support is not taken up, schools may issue escalated notices and, in serious cases, consider referral for legal action under the Education and Training Act 2020.

How you can help:

- Aim for 90%+ attendance and avoid non-essential appointments during class time.
- Contact the office first thing if your child is away (and tell us why).
- If getting to school is hard right now, please reach out—we can help put a plan in place.

I Thank you for your support in making sure tamariki are at school, ready to learn, every day the school is open. Together we can keep attendance strong and learning on track.

LEAVE YOUR CELL PHONE AT HOME & OFF SCHOOL BUSES

We kindly remind all parents, and students, that cell phones are not to be used at school. The government regulations require that: "Schools must ensure students do not use or access a phone while they are attending school, including during lunch time and breaks". Students are actively discouraged from bringing cellphones to school as they are not needed through the learning day. Any messages from parents or caregivers can be via the school office phone or email, or by texting to the school mobile. Students are also able to access the school phone to contact parents if required. If it is necessary that your child brings a cellphone to school then it MUST be left at the office during school hours. Students are not to have them during school time. This also extends to our school buses, where students who have them, should keep their phones turned off and in their school bags until home. Our school policy states that any found on a student during school time may be held overnight. Please discuss the use of cellphones with your children and support the school expectations. Thanks.
