PARKING SAFETY REMINDER - PLEASE HELP KEEP OUR STUDENTS SAFE

A friendly reminder to park safely and legally around the school, especially during pick-up times. We've noticed an increase in cars parking on dotted yellow lines and grass verges, which is a serious safety concern. This not only blocks visibility for our road patrol



but also puts students and pedestrians at risk. The local Police have raised concerns and will be doing random drive-by checks to monitor parking. Please be mindful of where you park to avoid any issues. What you can do to help:

- Park in designated areas and avoid stopping on yellow lines, grass verges, or footpaths.
- Be patient and considerate to ensure a safe and smooth pick-up process.
- Keep clear visibility around the Kea Crossing so our road patrol can do their job safely.

If it is necessary to bring cash or something special, they should be left with Leona in the office for safekeeping. Please note the school will not be responsible for lost money, toys or valuables that are not left in the office.

Measles Update – Be Prepared & Stay Informed

There has been a rising number of measles cases in Auckland schools, prompting health officials to issue reminders about the importance of vaccination, early detection, and prevention. Measles is highly contagious and can spread quickly in school environments. While there are no reported cases in our school at this stage, we encourage all families to be aware and prepared.

Know the Symptoms - Measles often starts with:

- High fever
- Cough, runny nose, and sore red eyes
- A rash that begins on the face and spreads to the body

If your child shows any symptoms, keep them home and seek medical advice immediately.

How to Protect Your Whānau

- Check your child's immunisation status two doses of the MMR vaccine provide strong protection.
- Be vigilant if your child is unwell, do not send them to school.
- 🔽 Follow health guidelines enclosed in this newsletter are official guidelines on measles prevention and response.

We urge all families to take this seriously. Let's work together to keep our community safe and well.
