2025 Mid Year Student Achievement Report

Student achievement testing was carried out at the end of term 2 and the results of this testing was presented to the board of trustees at our July 10 meeting.

Data has been compiled to represent our position in Reading, Maths and Writing from December (Term 4, 2024) to June (Term 2) this year (2025). Progress can be seen by comparing the assessments in each of the 3 core areas of Reading Maths and Writing.

The School Make Up:

Since December last year we have had 1 student leave to go to college. On top of this we have had 3 new entrant students begin school. This changes our population. We now have 9 children in the junior room and 10 children in the senior room.

To show progress this report will focus on the students that had been at School in December 2024 for at least a year with those same students that are here in June 2025. This is a group of

16 students. The 3 students not included will have their current level recorded. Their progress will be reported on in the next round of assessments.

Reading Summary:

The primary positive trend observed is a significant increase in the percentage of students performing "At" the expected reading level from 2024 to 2025.

- In the 2024 Reading End of Year data, 62.5% of students were "At"or above the expected level.
- By the 2025 Reading Mid Year data, this percentage rose to 87.5%. At or above the expected level

This represents a substantial improvement in the proportion of students meeting reading expectations. Additionally, the percentage of students categorized as "Well Below" the expected level in 2024 (6.3%) is no longer present in the 2025 data, suggesting that these students have improved their reading levels. There is also a notable decrease in the "Below" category from 31.3% in 2024 to 12.5% in 2025.

Maths Summary:

- In 2024, 81% of students were "At" or above the expected level.
- By mid-2025, this percentage increased to 93.8%."At" or above

This indicates a strong positive trend in students meeting math expectations. Additionally, the "Below" category, which was 6.3% in 2024, is no longer present in the 2025 data. While the "Well below" category remains, its percentage is reduced from 12.5% to 6.3% suggesting that these students have made progress as well. Furthermore, the percentage of students "Above" the expected level decreased from 31.3% in 2024 to 18.8% in 2025.

Writing Summary:

In Term 4 of 2024, the student performance was distributed as follows: 27.8% "above," 27.8% "at," 22.2% "below," and 22.2% "Well below".

By Mid-Year 2025, a significant shift occurred in the overall distribution: 70.6% of students were performing "at" the expected level, 17.6% were "below," and 11.8% were "well below". The "above" category is no longer present in the 2025 data.

In conclusion, while there's a notable increase in the percentage of students meeting the "at" standard, this appears to be largely influenced by the previous "above" cohort now performing at the "at" level. This suggests a potential decline in top-end achievement. Furthermore, the "below" cohort, while showing some progress, has not made sufficient accelerated gains to reach the "at" level. The continuous presence of a "well below" group, even if new students, indicates an ongoing challenge in addressing foundational writing skills.

It is interesting to look at the national averages for student achievement and it is great to see that Makuri school is well above average in all three areas.

The Makuri School Board is very happy with the progress that is happening in maths and reading achievement and realise there is still some work to do on the writing front, but are happy that the staff are putting plans in place to improve this. Student achievement will next be assessed at the end of term 4 and reported on in February 2026.
