Creating efficiencies for a productive workplace on farm Wednesday 27 November

Learn how on farm practices including milking frequency and use of technology can increase efficiency and improve workplace productivity.

Throughout a season on a New Zealand dairy farm, up to 57% of the time is spent milking. Milking frequency and efficiency can be an effective on farm practice to improve people productivity. Understand how changes within your milking system and use of technology can benefit your cows, staff and production while maintaining a profitable dairy business.

Flexible milking is widely used across farms in the Top of the South. Whether it is Twice a Day (TAD) with a variation post-Christmas, right through to Once a Day (OAD) milking all season. Jon and Vicki Nicholls have recently changed to a OAD system and introduced the use of wearable technology.

Hear from DairyNZ Farm Systems Specialist **Mark Speight** on recent research into the implications of variable milking frequencies and how they relate to the change in system on the Nicholls farm. Also, how the introduction of wearable technology within the system will benefit the farm and its future endeavours.

Find out more about:

- Different milking opportunities such as OAD, TAD or flexible milking
- MaxT a strategy to milk cows at a predetermined time based on milk volume. This results in less time in the dairy for staff and cows without affecting milk production or udder health
- How using technologies like automatic teat sprayers, adjusting pulsation ratio, training staff on milking routines and cupping techniques can benefit your farm practices
- DairyNZ tools that can assist on this topic, including the MilkSmart app and the Milking Time Planner
