“KA MAHI NGĀ KANOHI TĪKONGA A MATARIKI”

‘The ever-alert and protruding eyes of Matariki’

This proverb is said of a person who is wakeful and alert at night. The origin of this saying is the story in which Tāwhirimātea plucked out his eyes and threw them into the heavens, where they became Matariki. These protruding eyes are seen unblinking in the heavens, staring intently at the earth. A similar saying is ‘Tēnā ngā kanohi kua tikona e Matariki’
