News from the BOT

Last Thursday we had our 2nd meeting for the year. It was great to have everyone in attendance.

- Tracey presented in depth assessment data from the beginning of the year testing and how plans were in place to support the students who were below the expected level. The new Structured Maths Programme, PR1ME, and Structured Literacy Programme, IDeal, that the school is implementing this year will also go a long way to helping with consistency across the school, transition between the classes and closing the achievement gaps. These new structured maths and literacy programmes will cost the school \$15,000 (\$12,000 for Ideal & \$3,000 for PR1ME), funded largely through the generous donation from the the baling fundraiser so many thanks to those of you who pitched in to help. It is great to see our hard work helping students and teachers directly.
- We discussed how we can support our migrant families more to be part of our school community. As a result, Alexa is going to work on setting up a buddy system.
- Tanya updated us on the work she is doing on our school policies and procedures. We have joined School Docs, a company that will save us from reinventing the wheel; however, there is a lot of work involved in getting set up, and Tanya has been beavering away on this.
- We discussed how we are meeting the government's new policy on ensuring that each class has an average of an hour of reading, writing and maths each week.

The next meeting is scheduled for Thursday May the 30th.
