



Te Wiki o Te Reo Mijori (Mijori language week) is coming up next week, running from Sunday 14th to Saturday 20th September! It is an annual celebration for all New Zealanders to show their support for the Misori language, an official language of Aotearoa and a taonga (treasure) that connects us to the whenua (land), to the history,

This year's focus is all about making te reo Māori visible, and making te reo Māori more present and heard in everyday life. Whether it's at home, in the lunchroom, in the classroom, or out in the community, everyday use of even a few kupu (words) helps build confidence, understanding, and a sense of shared

A fun idea - challenge yourself and your whitinau to learn one new kupu Mitori related to kai or wellbeing each day this week. Words like huariskua (triut), inu (drink), or hauora (wellbeing) are simple but meaningful ways to start weaving the language into your daily routine.
