To The Ashley Clinton and Makaretu Community

The Ashley Clinton Fire Brigade are made up of a team of 14 volunteers and 2 trainee recruits who are trained in a wide variety of skills. To become a qualified rural fire fighter, we have to have a full medical and complete an extensive First Aid Course. Then we complete a recruitment course which is 7 days of training and once completed to the required standard we have earnt the title of Fire Fighter. To progress through the ranks, various courses are available from pump operator, emergency driver, senior fire fighter, through to Station Officer.

Every two years we have to complete a refresher First Aid Course. We are trained to administer oxygen, use AED (Automated external defibrillator) and we carry a Trauma kit.

Our brigade often hears about emergencies after the event and we would like to remind our community of our skills. We could be at your side giving support before other services arrive, potentially lifesaving. Along with our medical equipment and firefighting equipment we have heat detection and climbing gear..
