One key decision we've made as a staff is to use workbooks and textbooks as teaching resources rather than as daily prescribed materials. Our focus is on teaching to the curriculum in a way that best meets the needs of our learners.

Following is an insightful media release from Leanne Otene, President of the New Zealand Principals' Federation. Unfortunately, this wasn't widely covered by the media, so we felt it was important to share with you all.

The New Zealand Principals' Federation (NZPF) President, Leanne Otene, has expressed her surprise at the recent pronouncements of the Minister of Education, on the Q and A Show, that the roll out of the new curriculum in Literacy and Mathematics is going magnificently well.
"Other than Cambridge Intermediate School, I am not sure which schools the Minister is visiting, but this is not the feedback I am receiving as President of the Principals Federation," she said.

"I am hearing from schools that the year by year mathematics curriculum is not working at all well - especially in Intermediate schools - who have received only year 7 and 8 resources, yet have children up to two or even three years below that level and some children exceeding their level," she

said.

"We have been very clear for many years now that our learners do not arrive at school all the same. They arrive at school with a broad range of readiness for formal learning, and about 30% will need some form of learning support. Conversely, there are children who exceed their year level. That is why we have always opposed a year by year curriculum," said Otene, "because it sets up an expectation that every child is exactly at their year level, which is simply not true," she said.

Otene was also less optimistic than the Minister about the roll out of the professional learning for teachers and principals, and said trying to change two major areas of the curriculum at once was not the best way to design

curriculum change.

"We are pleased that the Minister has offered free professional learning in Mathematics and Literacy for our principals and teachers," said Otene, "however we have received varying feedback on the quality of professional learning on offer, because it is a 'one-size-fits-all approach'", she said.

"We know that schools are at different stages of development, with some having adopted structured literacy, for example, several years ago and some are well familiar with the mathematics resources. Other schools have no experience of either structured literacy or structured mathematics," she said.

"NZPF called for a slowdown of the curriculum change, asking for one subject at a time," she said, " so that teachers and principals could be fully trained and feel confident and competent to implement the changes," she said.
"If we are to be successful, then it is critical that we also inject substantial resources into learning support," said Otene. "Successive governments have failed to adequately address learning support, and we have seen no improvements with the present government," she said.

Children's Obstacle Course

A little about the challenge:

"The Mitre 10 MEGA Tough Kid® is a fun and challenging obstacle course designed for primary (Yr 3-6) school children. The aim of the day is participation and fun in a "challenge by choice" philosophy that promotes confidence-building and personal achievement. The course includes lots of running with obstacles the kids need to navigate such as cargo nets, cable reels, climbing wall, bank climb & slide as well as lots of other challenging and fun tasks".

When: Thursday 3rd April, 11.30am - 2pm

Who: All Year 3-6's

**How:** We will be travelling by bus to and from the event

**Departure Times:** We will depart Frasertown school at 9am

As the event will not finish until 2pm, we estimate we will be arriving back to Frasertown at 4pm, and will do a bus drop off at the New World bus stop on our way through Wairoa. We will send a text, post on Facebook, and on skool loop, when we leave Hastings, so you can keep track with pick up times.

#### What to wear

All students must wear their Frasertown school shirt, school hat and are able to wear any shorts. As there is water and mud on the course it is recommended that long pants are not worn. Shoes are required for travel but are optional for the event, and bare feet will be at the risk of the individual. Students will need a spare change of warm clothing, as they will get wet and cold during their race - this does not need to be a school uniform.

#### Food and Drink

We will provide our school lunches. You will just need to send their morning tea along. It is a good idea for each child to bring a water bottle with them. Water will be available around the venue for people to fill their water bottles up. There will not be a set lunch break as there will be plenty of time for children between the race/s they are involved in.




